

VISITOR/VOLUNTEER HEALTH POLICY During COVID-19

(8.12.2021)

ALL VISITORS AND VOLUNTEERS

All visitors and volunteers coming on site to an Orange County Rescue Mission campus for a meeting, tour, visit, volunteer service, etc. are required to **self-screen** at home before departing, including temperature and symptom checks. Visitors and volunteers will have their temperatures checked again by our staff with a touch free infrared thermometer when they check-in at front desk.

People with COVID-19 have had a wide range of symptoms reported – ranging from mild symptoms to severe illness. Symptoms may appear **2-14 days after exposure to the virus.** People with these symptoms may have COVID-19(cdc.gov, 2/22/2021):

- Fever or chills
- Cough
- · Shortness of breath or difficulty breathing
- Fatigue
- Muscle or body aches
- Headache
- New loss of taste or smell
- Sore throat
- Congestion or runny nose
- Nausea or vomiting
- Diarrhea

(This list does not include all possible symptoms.)

If you have experienced any of these symptoms in the last week or have been exposed to anyone with the above symptoms within the last 14 days, please re-schedule your visit.

CALIFORNIA DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC HEALTH STATE ORDER eff. July 26, 2021

All volunteers and visitors will be required to wear masks, regardless of vaccination status, while indoors at all times.

FOR VOLUNTEERS:

Upon arrival at Village of Hope, **volunteers will be provided an FDA-approved surgical mask** by front desk reception and will be required to wear OCRM-issued surgical masks indoors at all times. Face coverings and cloth masks cannot be used in place of company-supplied surgical masks.
